Streets of London, Mark Harris + Peter Lloyd Lewis, Nov–Dec 2003

Documenting a series of events in London and in Richmond, Virginia, an exhibition at London Gallery 1 000 000 mph incorporates live music, a video sculpture and photographs of the previous weeks' performances/happenings.

The Invitation

To see what happens when a number of musicians and buskers are invited to make use of a gallery as they wish. They are asked to play a song of their choice which they associate with London and to perform an interpretation of Ralph McTell's classic recording *Streets of London*, recorded in 1969.

The Response

Nineteen musicians and groups take part. Two of the four video loops show musicians playing versions of McTell's song; a third shows London musicians playing their own music; the fourth shows Richmond musicians playing versions of the Clash's *London Calling*.

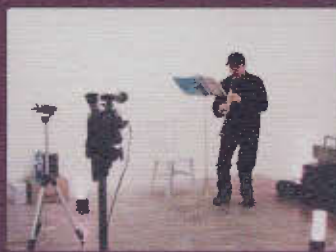
